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1 Overview


The Windcave PayPal integration enables any merchant using Windcave Hosted Payment Page (HPP) to expand their ecommerce storefront to accept PayPal. The PayPal solution is available via the Windcave REST API and in most cases merchants with Windcave can add this feature without additional development work.

This is a great option for merchants to offer an alternate payment method for their customers who prefer to use their PayPal account over standard credit card or want to accept extra card types. Combined with Windcave HPP this is a cutting edge solution for today's online retailers and service providers.

This document will guide you through the steps required to procure the relevant information required for setting up your PayPal merchant account for use with Windcave HPP.


1. Visit PayPal's developer portal here: <https://developer.paypal.com>




2. Log In

3. Click on "Create App" under the REST API apps heading




4. Enter App Name (This can be anything the merchant wants. It does not matter to Windcave). Click "Create App" button.



5. Once the App is created, you will be shown your API Credentials. The Client ID and Secret Key needs to be provided to Windcave for setup.

NB: you can select Sandbox for testing or Live for production using the button on the top right.
